For the past several years, travel writers have been rating Croatia as one of the ten "best vacation hot spots in the world." The travel trade magazines are saying the same. It is now the hottest destination in the greater Adriatic and Mediterranean area. Now that demand is up, sadly so are the prices for the land cost, the air ticket, as well as the air taxes. We fell in love with the area our first time there and have so enjoyed every visit since then! It has many areas that UNESCO lists as among the most beautiful Classic World Heritage sites on the planet (Plitvice Lakes, Split, and Dubrovnik among them), and *Condé Nast Magazine* ranks Hvar Island as one of the top ten islands to visit in the world. In addition to Croatia, we also include beautiful Bled, Slovenia, and the World Heritage site of Kotor, Montenegro. One trip, three countries—all done at a nice pace!

Croatia has as much to offer as several other fascinating countries put together. If you like the castles and valleys of Austria, Germany and France, you will love Croatia. In fact, after the Loire Valley in France, the Castle region (the Zagorje region) of Croatia has the highest concentration of castles in Europe. If you love the French Riviera, the Italian Riviera or the Amalfi Coast in Italy, you will really love the Istrian and Dalmatian coasts of Croatia. If you like capital cities like Budapest, etc., you will love Zagreb. If you like beautiful lush green mountains and blue lakes, you will love Plitvice Lakes. If you like the Greek Islands, you will love Croatia's 1,100 islands! Croatia has good wine, fabulous beaches and coastline and islands, ravishing scenery, historic cities, charming villages, picturesque towns, marvelous churches and monasteries, folk art, fascinating culture, striking architecture, and well-preserved Roman ruins and antiquities. Though Croatia's heartland lies in Eastern Europe, the country's Slavic soul has been leavened by its proximity to the Mediterranean and Italy.

In the interior of the country are mountains dotted with vineyards, castles, lakes and waterfalls. Zagreb, the capital with its lively coffee houses, outdoor cafes and extensive parks, is reminiscent of Prague and Vienna. The rugged Dalmatian coast is simply spectacular, with towering mountains forming a backdrop for the long narrow strip of land and rock whose edges are washed by the clear water of the Adriatic Sea. Outstanding seafood! There are more than 1,100 islands offshore, some uninhabited and others dotted with ancient villages. Some of the best yachting in the world is here among these islands.

In size, Croatia compares to all of Ireland. The population is approximately 4.5 million. Zagreb is the capital. More than half of it borders the Adriatic Sea, just across from Italy. Its northern border is with beautiful Slovenia. Croatia is replete with foreign influences—Roman amphitheatres, Venetian palaces, Hapsburg castles, Italian food—because its history has been marked by periods of different foreign domination.

Croatia will appeal to all people but especially to those who have already visited the main areas of Europe and are looking to get off the beaten path a bit and discover a most fascinating part of our world! It is literally filled with hidden treasures waiting for you to discover.

The hotels are rated in the four- or five-star category, and they all have great locations. Most have swimming pools. Some, not all, have air conditioning. At the coast, you can swim and snorkel (and even dive). Good shopping is never that far away! Croatia is not about hotels—it's about having the best of what is available in all areas and being able to have a base camp from which to explore each area of this beautiful country. Please note, however, that if we have a hotel near the water there is no way to guarantee that each and every room will face the water. All rooms are assigned on a random basis by the hotel a few days before we arrive, based on what rooms are available.

The program provides an excellent mix of guided and free time. People who have gone on this trip before say that it flows very well. One man said, "It is not a trip, it is a vacation!" With so many great restaurants to choose from each area in we stay, you will appreciate the fact you are have free nights to make your own choice from the varied dining experiences that await you.

Your outstanding tour manager (who is with you from the time we land in Zagreb until you leave) is Nikola Spehar (we call him Nick). He speaks four languages, was an officer in the Merchant Marines for ten years after getting out of college, and has been to almost every port and country in the world. Everyone loves him! He educates us and looks out for us in fine fashion 24 hours a day.

ITINERARY

Legend: The letter B = full breakfast. L = lunch. D = dinner. When you see one or more of these letters at the end of each day's schedule it means this meal is included as part of your package. We encourage you to explore, so we have not built in dinners every night. Eating out at night is a lot of what makes the trip so fun!

Day 1: Thursday, May 17: Depart the USA

Day 2: Friday, May 18: Arrive Zagreb

Upon arrival, Nick the guide will greet you and transfer the group to the five-star Esplanade Hotel (or similar). Tonight you get over jet lag to be ready to roll tomorrow morning. Note: Nick usually take the group for a short walk around town to loosen up after we check in.





Day 3: Saturday, May 19: Zagreb to Bled, Slovenia

After breakfast you'll head north into the beautiful countryside of Slovenia. You'll have a few stops for photo ops and then enjoy lunch on top of a little hill in the Castle Country. Not only are there castles on distant hills, but many vineyards and valleys also surround the location. After lunch you'll drive onward to the beautiful little lakeside town of Bled. Bled is a lake at the base of the Julian Alps. Your hotel for one night will be the Hotel Park (or similar). You will enjoy Bled! B. L.

Day 4: Sunday, May 20: Bled, Slovenia to Rovinj, Croatia

This morning you'll enjoy a ride on little unique row boats to a small island in the middle of the lake, as well as a visit to a castle located on top of a large monolithic like rock. Then you'll head off to Istria to a picturesque fishing village called Rovinj. Some people call it the "Venice of Croatia" while others have said it looks like a town from a fairy tale. Cobblestone streets, a central promenade, shops, galleries, colorful markets, and many restaurants await you. You'll be staying at Hotel Eden (or similar), which is a terrific larger four-star property with nice grounds and a huge swimming pool with a 20-minute walk into the center of town. Now that you're over jetlag, you'll enjoy your Welcome Dinner tonight. B, D.

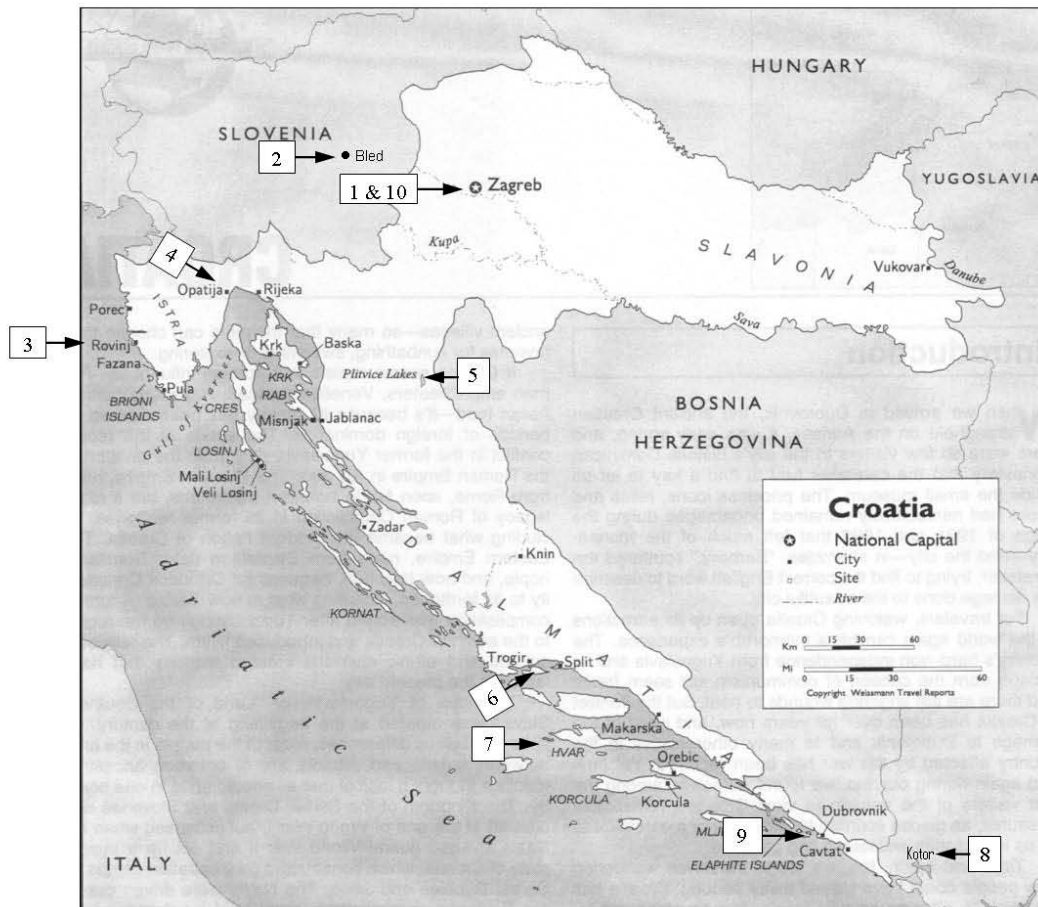
Day 5: Monday, May 21: Rovinj, Croatia

Day 6: Tuesday, May 22: Rovinj > Pula > Opatija

You'll head south to Pula where you'll stop to tour the historic amphitheater. Then, off to beautiful Opatija, which sits in a spectacular setting known as the Riviera of Croatia. It was a renowned spa for the Hapsburgs during the Austrian-Hungarian Empire times. It also offers a casino and some nightlife. You are on your own for dinner. You'll spend two nights at the lovely Hotel Adriatic (or similar). Nick (who lives in this area) will take you on a short orientation walking tour to include seeing some of the grand vacation homes from the Hapsburg times. The hotel is not far from a very beautiful five-mile paved path along the water. Maybe walk half of it today and half tomorrow? You would miss something special if you did not! B

Day 7: Wednesday, May 23: Opatija

This morning you will enjoy a beautiful, panoramic boat ride on the Adriatic along the coastline. You'll see how beautiful this area is! You are on your own in the afternoon and this evening for dinner. Don't forget to explore the terrific walking path along the coastline! Enjoy the day! B.



Day 8: Thursday, May 24: Opatija to Plitvice Lakes

The Plitvice Lakes are surrounded by lush, forested mountains and have 16 levels of lakes connected by waterfalls. It is one of the most beautiful national parks in all of Europe and is a UNESCO World Natural Heritage site. This afternoon you'll walk the upper lakes trail, which is composed of a very nice wooden walkway. Tonight you'll enjoy dinner together at the Licka Kuca lodge near the park. Overnight at Hotel Jezero (or similar) in the national park. B, D.

Day 9: Friday, May 25: Plitvice Lakes to Trogir/Split

This morning you'll have a walking tour of the fantastically beautiful lower-level lakes. On one level you'll ride a flat-bottom boat to the next level and go from there. You won't see all 16 lakes, as that would take a week, but you will see the best of the best. You'll then drive to the historic area of Split for a one-night stay in the World Heritage site of Trogir, a small, charming medieval town. There are no larger hotels inside the walls of Trogir, so the group might be split between two or three hotels, all close together. It is on this day that you'll see the transformation of terrain between Istria (the north of Croatia) and that of the Dalmatian Coast. Split (which you'll visit tomorrow) is another seaport on the Dalmatian coast and is designated by UNESCO as a cultural treasure. Its palm-lined oceanfront promenade is reminiscent of the French Riviera, but the rest of the old city reveals a striking combination of Roman, Venetian and Hapsburg influences. The Roman emperor Diocletian built a palace in the 4th century in what is now the heart of old town in Split. The ruins here are thought to be the best-preserved Roman architecture in Eastern Europe. Split is a feast for the senses! You will love walking the old lamp-lit cobblestone streets of Trogir this evening and finding a great place to eat. We'll be in great position near Split to catch our ferry to Hvar tomorrow. Overnight at the Hotel Fontana (or similar). B.

Day 10: Saturday, May 26: Trogir/Split to Hvar Island

This morning you'll check out of the Trogir hotel and have a walking tour of Split and the Palace of Diocletian, after which you will have free time to do as you wish until mid-afternoon when we meet at the dock to catch the ferry for the beautiful two-hour ride to Hvar Island. Once on Hvar, you'll bus over the hill down to the port town of Hvar where you'll check in to our 4-star hotel, the Amfora (or similar), for a three-night stay. Nick will take the group for an orientation walk around sunset time. Hvar is called the sunniest island in the entire Adriatic. **Condé Nast Magazine rates Hvar Island as one of the top ten islands in the world!** The Greeks, Romans, Venetians, Austrians and the French all occupied this area and have left their influence. The town of Hvar, which is small but breathtakingly beautiful, crowds up a steep hill with the usual fortress at the top, which overlooks the scenic fishing village-like harbor with myriads of restaurants. B.



Day 11: Sunday, May 27: Hvar

After breakfast you'll drive to the other side of the island to explore two quaint port towns with time for snacks, shopping and a bite to eat, of course. Once you return to the hotel, you are on your own for the next day and a half to explore and enjoy as you wish. Nick can provide you with ideas of things to do. It is a great place to relax, to swim, to shop, to hike and to eat well at your choice of the many restaurants. It's almost like being on vacation! B.

Day 12: Monday, May 28: Hvar

Full day to relax and do as you wish. B.

Day 13: Tuesday, May 29: Hvar to Kotor, Montenegro

This morning you'll drive to the south end of Hvar Island to take the short 30-minute ferry ride to the mainland where we then take a drive through lovely valleys and along a beautiful coastline, past Dubrovnik another hour or so, down into Montenegro, another beautiful small Adriatic country. Kotor is a medieval walled city that is on the UNESCO World Heritage list. It lies at the southern end of the Bay of Kotor. You'll enjoy lunch on our own here and then head out on a boat ride on the Kotor Fjord. You are on your own for dinner. You'll stay at the centrally located Hotel Vardar (or similar). During your free time you will enjoy walking the narrow streets, investigating the shops and seeing St. Tripohon's Cathedral. You can also sit along the banks of the bay and just relax. Note: The hotel does not have any twin beds, only one large bed in each room (but they can provide a cot for the second person if we have two singles in a room). B.

Day 14: Wednesday, May 30: Kotor, Montenegro, to Dubrovnik, Croatia

In the afternoon you'll drive north to Dubrovnik, which, for some, will be the highlight of the trip. You're here for three nights. Dubrovnik, known as "the Crown Jewel of the Mediterranean," is set on a peninsula jutting into the Adriatic. It is simply one of the prettiest places in the world.

This medieval walled city is 1,000 years old and an architectural marvel. Entering its gates is like a step back in time. The old town is almost completely untouched by the modern world.



In some places the city walls are 20 feet thick. Our hotel is the President Hotel (or similar). Note that you might have the couple-hour walking city tour of Dubrovnik after we arrive. It all depends on if there are any cruise ships in town, which jam the city with people until later afternoon. This evening (or maybe tomorrow) the group will enjoy a nice dinner together. B, D.



Day 15: Thursday, May 31: Dubrovnik

This morning, if you did not do it yesterday afternoon, you will enjoy a walking tour of Dubrovnik and the afternoon is free to explore as you wish. You should make the time to walk all the way around on the castle walls of the old city. It takes about an hour and forty-five minutes. Great photo ops! B.

Day 16: Friday, June 1: Dubrovnik

A full free day to shop, explore, swim, relax, as you wish. B.

Day 17: Saturday, June 2: Dubrovnik to Zagreb

The group will try to catch the early morning flight back to Zagreb. If so, when you arrive you'll enjoy a walking tour of Old Town before checking into the Esplanade Hotel (or similar). The afternoon is free time. This evening we will have your Farewell dinner with a half-liter of wine per person included. B, D.

Day 18: Sunday, June 3: Zagreb to USA

Time to head home, with all your memories and souvenirs! B.

Prices from Portland range from \$1,250 to \$1,600, per person, depending on itinerary. **Do not purchase air tickets until we confirm that we have enough people to go on the trip.**

Single / Roommates

If you are signing up alone, and hoping to find another of the same gender to share the room with, please be aware that most of the time someone shows up. If this happens we put you in contact with each other to see if you both agree all is OK to share. Things to discuss are snoring, smoking, who likes the window open or closed at night and if one goes to bed early and the other likes to enjoy the nightlife a little bit, etc. There is a place on the sign-up sheet that asks if you will pay the single supplement to go if a roommate is not found for you.

Other Information

Be aware that we need 10 people minimum signed up to make the trip a go at this price. So, don't purchase any air tickets until you hear from us the trip is a firm go.

If you have trouble walking, or have some other health problem, please bring a companion with you to assist you in whatever limitations you might have. We, or others in the group, cannot be counted on to provide such assistance. Europe is a lot of up and down walking in certain areas. If you have a problem walking there might be some areas it would be best for you to stay with the bus while the group walks up or down at that time.

Deposit: \$500 per person. The sign-up sheets are the last few pages. Upon receiving your deposit, we will mail you a receipt and other information. All spots are sold on a first-come, first-serve basis so get the deposit in to secure your spot(s).

Final payment: March 15, 2012. An invoice will be mailed to you prior to that date. As with all international trips, the price of the trip was based on the exchange rate at the time of

costing and is always subject to change until we mail you the final invoice and we receive your final payment.

Pre-Trip Meeting: The time and place will be sent to you along with the invoice. If you can't make the meeting, the final informational packet will be mailed to you the next day.

Passports: Passports are required. Visas and shots are not.

Post-Trip Picture Party: Our custom is to have a post-trip picture party around 30 days after we return from the trip. Someone in the group usually volunteers to host the party and their home. It is a BYOB/potluck gathering. People bring their scrapbooks and pictures to share, and it's great fun to share stories and pictures.

Trip Cancellation Fee and Schedule: All cancellations must be in writing. The following table shows the amount each person would forfeit for cancellation for any reason.

OTHER GENERAL INFORMATION

Luggage: Each person is limited to one large suitcase with 44 lbs. maximum and one carry-on bag. (It's best if the suitcase has wheels and a pull-handle these days.) You don't need more. Yes, the airlines say you can check two suitcases per person but the problem comes with the land operators and they restrict you to one large suitcase. Two reasons:

1. There is not enough room in the cargo area of the bus to carry two large suitcases per person. You would wind up with your second one sitting on your lap.
2. The trip includes the portage of one suitcase per person from the bus to your hotel room and back at four- and five-star hotels. At three-star hotels we might be asked to pull our luggage to our rooms, as they don't have the hotel staff to transport the luggage in a timely manner.

You don't need more than one suitcase with 44 lbs. of stuff per person. We are not on a fashion show type trip, and it's OK to wear the same thing more than once or to mix and match. The trick is to be comfortable, not dressed up all the time. We are on vacation!

Pat & Mike's reserves the right to accept or decline any person as a passenger on one of our custom-designed trips should such person's health or mental condition, physical infirmity or general deportment impede the operation of the tour or the rights and welfare or enjoyment of other tour passengers; and the refund of unused land tour services is the limit of Pat & Mike's Travel Company liability.

TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE

Available through Pat & Mike's Travel. If you want to sign up for a trip, please read the following:

1. IF YOU DON'T HAVE A PRE-EXISTING MEDICAL CONCERN / CONDITION (EITHER YOU OR A MEMBER OF YOUR IMMEDIATE FAMILY) OR IF YOU HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT IF YOU HAVE A PRE-EXISTING CONDITION OR NOT. Mail in your sign-up sheets, deposit and a copy of the picture page of your passport. We will send you a receipt letter that contains a trip cancellation insurance policy for you to review for possible purchase. If you want to purchase the insurance, you will need to complete the application and mail it (along with the premium), directly to the insurance company, not to us.

But before you mail it, check with us make sure we have enough signed up to ensure the trip is a go. If we cancel the trip, you will receive your deposit back in full, so there is no need to pay an insurance premium when there is no risk. We will inform you when there we have enough people signed up to ensure the trip is a firm go. Then you can purchase the insurance.

Another thing to consider before you purchase the insurance: Look at the trip cancellation policy and see what dollar amount you would lose on such and such dates if you had to cancel. It is smart to wait until the amount you would lose if you cancelled is greater than the insurance premium amount. For example: You sign up today and for the next four months all you would lose if you had to cancel is, let's say, \$50. Let's say the insurance premium is \$250. There is no need to pay \$250 premium to get \$50 back if you had to cancel. Find the date that the cancellation penalty is greater than \$250 and then mail in the insurance premium.

2. IF YOU DON'T KNOW FOR SURE IF YOU OR A MEMBER OF YOUR IMMEDIATE FAMILY HAS A CONDITION THAT MIGHT FALL UNDER WHAT THE INSURANCE COMPANY CALLS A PRE-EXISTING CONDITON. Before you sign up for the trip, call the insurance company and tell them you are thinking about going on a trip and before you sign up for the trip, or the trip cancellation insurance, you want to fully understand what the insurance company considers a "pre-existing condition" for you or a member of your immediate family. Ask follow-up questions. Insurance companies change rules all the time. I heard one person say they were told that if you take high blood pressure medicine, even though your BP readings are fine, it is still considered a pre-existing condition. Again, ask follow-up questions and get the name of the person you are talking with. The name of the insurance company is TRAVEL INSURED. Their telephone number is 1.800.243.3174.

Most times if a person has a pre-existing condition, or if a member of their immediate family does, the insurance company will waive the pre-existing condition IF the insurance is purchase within 14 days of signing up for the trip.

If the insurance company tells you that you or a member of your immediate family has a pre-existing condition and you want to go on the trip and purchase trip cancellation insurance:

Call us and tell us that you have a pre-existing condition situation and you want to sign up for the trip for sure. We will pencil you in. Then find out if there are enough signed up yet to ensure the trip is a go.

If there is not enough then ask Pat & Mike's to add your name(s) to those wanting to go on the trip and when enough have signed up, and you are notified of such, then you would mail in the sign-up pages, the copy of the picture page of your passport and the deposit to Pat & Mike's AND at the same time mail off the trip cancellation insurance application along with the premium direct to the insurance company (not to Pat & Mike's). Again, don't purchase insurance until such time you know the trip is a go.

If there are enough people signed up to ensure the trip is a go, then send in your deposit and sign-up pages, etc. to Pat & Mike's Travel Co and send the insurance application and premium direct to the insurance company.
