- The country is so diverse we could easily add another ten days to show you areas you don't have time to see. Too many people go to Asia and sign up for trips that give them four days in various countries. On a Pat and Mike's trip, we take the time to get a good feel for this fascinating, historic land.
- Everyone who has taken this trip loves Vietnam and the flow of this trip! We mix urban and rural, beach and forest, night outings with total relaxation.
- The weather in the north is different than in the south. When it is cooler (55 - 60° F) in Hanoi, it can be 85° F in Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC, or Saigon) in the south. On this trip we start off cooler in the north and slide into the warmer areas as we move south.
- Rest assured that all the hotels, by any standard in the world, are excellent! All have outstanding air conditioning systems. Most have swimming pools. We have upgraded some of the hotels and the overnight train to Sapa so that you have a comfortable and enjoyable experience.
- There are photo opportunities in all directions at all times! Vietnam is truly one of the most beautiful countries in the world, and we've been to many. We never tire of the breathtaking mountains or gazing at the South China Sea.
- While the Vietnam Wars (first against the French, then the Americans) are an important source of both great sadness and pride for Vietnamese, they consider it history. You'll find that Vietnam has moved on! It is one of the youngest, most dynamic and optimistic countries in the world. Everywhere you go you'll be greeted by warm smiles and polite consideration ... no matter where you're from.



We're looking for the following types of people to go on the trip:

- Are flexible, adaptable, and friendly
- Like to travel and experience life and all that a beautiful, developing country has to offer
- Like to meet people from other countries and cultures
- Can go with the flow
- Understand that the hotels, other than in Hanoi, although excellent, don't have names

- Realize that it might be hot and humid outside at times in the southern part of the country, or maybe cooler than you like in the northern part of the country
- Understand that things might not go exactly according to plan at times ... flexibility and experiencing what comes is part of the fun of travel
- If a Vietnam veteran is with us, he or she adds a plus to the experience

This custom-designed itinerary is among the best, most in-depth, and best-value tours to Vietnam offered today. Even though the hotels are excellent, the trip is not about hotels. It is about what you see and experience with our time outside of the hotel. Many meals are provided and the food will be a mixture of Vietnamese, Asian, seafood, and some European-type meals. The French were in Vietnam for years and their cooking style had great impact on how they cook.

The terrain consists of four basic regions: the delta of the Red River in the North, which is almost mountainous in places; the beautiful mountains in the northwest area near the border of China; the delta of the Mekong River in the South, which is quite flat; and the hilly, narrow central region connecting the two. It is bordered on the east by a beautiful coastline. This itinerary allows us to see a great variety – cities and sites starting first in Hanoi and working our way south to Ho Chi Minh City (old Saigon) and Can Tho in the heart of the Mekong Delta.

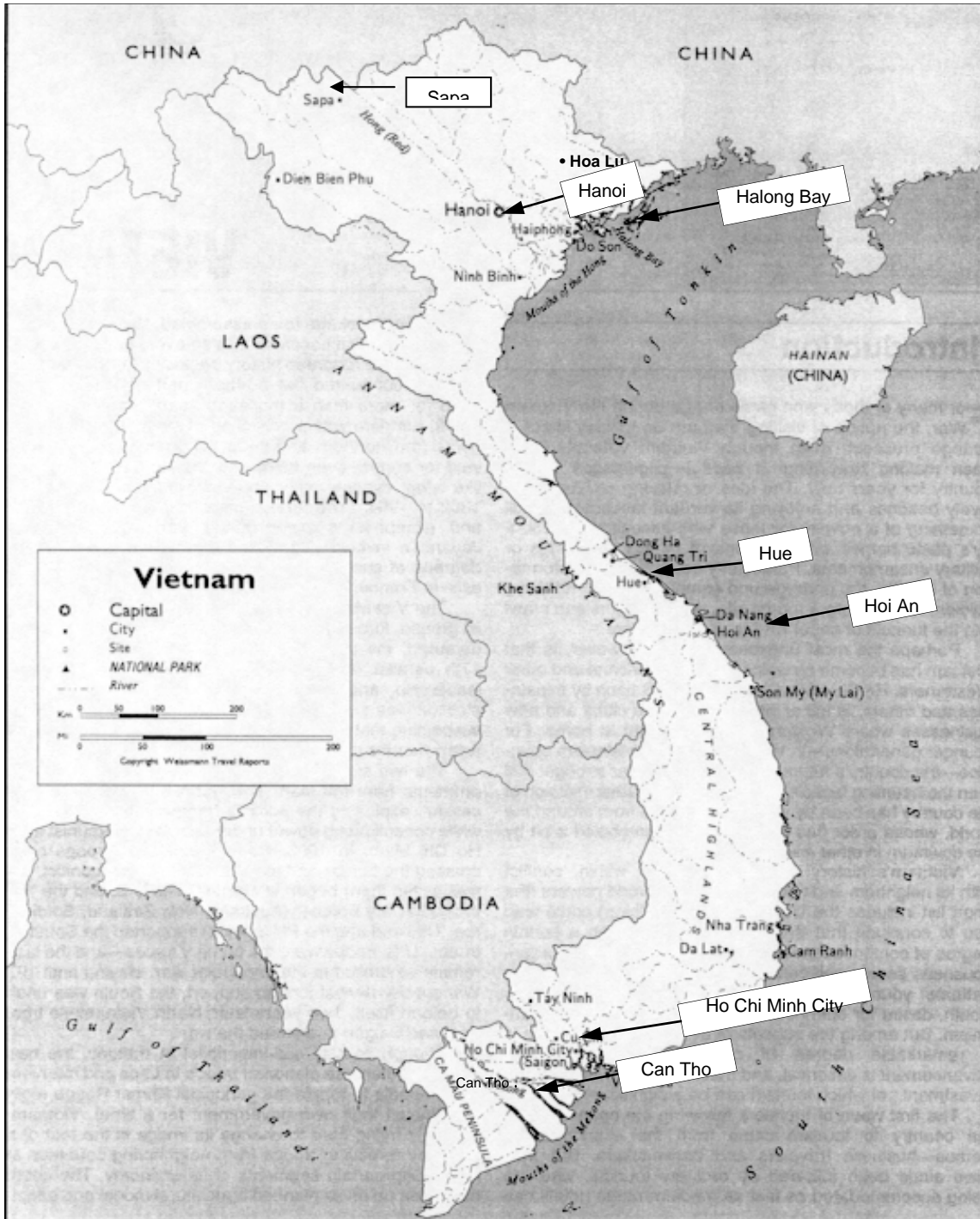
A Snapshot of Our Itinerary

Note: The letter B = breakfast; L = lunch; D = dinner. If seen at the end of the description of each daily plan it means that meal is included as part of your trip package.

Day 1: Sunday, February 26: We need to arrive in Hanoi by February 27. Depending on your flight schedule, you might need to leave on February 26 or 27.

Day 2: Monday, February 27:
Arrive Hanoi, Vietnam: Upon arrival we transfer to the Hilton Hanoi Opera hotel (www.hanoi.hilton.com), situated in an excellent location next to the Opera House and a short walk to the Old French Quarter. The rest of the day and evening are free. Sleep well tonight as we have a full day tomorrow.





Overnight stays:

1. Sapa (1 night)
2. Hanoi (2 nights total)
3. Ha Long Bay (1 night)
4. Hue (2 nights)
5. Hoi An (1 night)
6. Ho Chi Minh City (3 nights total)
7. Can Tho (1 night)

Day 3: Tuesday, February 28: Hanoi – Lao Cai: A fun day! We'll start with a pedicab ride to visit the historic French Quarter. We then have an orientation tour of Hanoi that includes a visit to Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum area and his former residence; the One Pillar Pagoda and then the Temple of Literature and then the Hanoi Hilton (where American prisoners were held). After that, we'll return to the hotel, where you have free time to relax and have lunch. In the afternoon, we'll visit the outstanding Ethnology Museum and then enjoy the famous water puppet show followed by our welcome dinner.

After dinner, we're off to the train station to catch luxurious overnight train that belongs to the Victoria Sapa Hotel (<http://www.victoriahotels-asia.com/eng/hotels-in-vietnam/sapa-resort-spa/victoria-express-train>). Pack a small bag with some clothes for a few days and some snacks for the train, and then let the ride begin! (You can leave you big bags at the hotel in Hanoi.) **B, D.**

Day 4: Wednesday, February 29: Lao Cai - Sapa: We arrive in Sapa around 5:30 a.m. Lots of people have said that what we will see and experience over the next two days was the highlight of the trip.

Tucked high in Vietnam's remote northern mountains, the former French military outpost of Sapa offers some of Vietnam's most colorful experiences. The views are breathtaking. Major ethnic groups to be found here are the H'mong, Red Zao, Xapho and Tai, with their traditional dress and customs. Sapa sits at 4,800 feet above sea level and is surrounded by 10,000-foot mountains called the Tonkin Alps that border China. The area has many terraces of rice and lush vegetation.

After breakfast, we'll head up the road to Myong Khuong district, which weaves its way up and over hills of tea plantations and pine trees. It gets wilder and greener with thick forest and small tribal villages scattering isolated on slopes of the mountains as you get close to Cao Son commune.

When we arrive in Cao Son, we will have a little break. Today will be a market day, and the whole village will be there to trade goods. Many come from remote villages, near the border and. Many villagers sell homemade goods, animals, tools, and so on.

After lunch, we'll leave the market and drive to Lai Cai and then uphill to Sapa. We'll arrive at the hotel in the afternoon, and the rest of the day is free time for you to explore and relax. Lots of restaurant choices await you in Sapa. Overnight at the beautiful Victoria Sapa Resort Hotel (<http://www.victoriahotels-asia.com/eng/hotels-in-vietnam/sapa-resort-spa>). **B, L, D.**

Day 5: Thursday, March 1: Sapa – Ta Van Village -- overnight train to Hanoi: The morning is free to explore on your own. In the afternoon, we'll drive south toward Muong Hoa valley, where we'll see rice paddies, where the minorities H'mong, Day, and Dao people dress in the traditional style unique to the northern region of Vietnam. We'll learn about rice cultivation and then continue to the Black Hmong village of Lao Chai to the Giay

minority village of Ta Van to see the Zay minority group doing their daily work. Around 4:30, we'll drive back to Lao Cai province to the train station.

In the evening we'll have dinner at a local restaurant and then meet the night train for the overnight train back to Hanoi. **B, D.**

Day 6: Friday, March 2: Hanoi: Arrive back in Hanoi in the morning. After a breakfast and rest, the rest of the day is free for you to explore and relax. Overnight at the Hilton Hanoi Opera hotel. **B.**

Day 7: Saturday, March 3: Hanoi – Ha Long: After breakfast we leave Hanoi and travel by bus northwest to the World Heritage area known as Ha Long Bay. This is the most



popular side-trip out of Hanoi. The South China Sea in this area is characterized by 1600 beautiful limestone "mountains" rising from the sea. We arrive around noon and board the very nice Bhaya boat (<http://bhayacruises.com/>). The first thing we do is get assigned to our cabins. We'll enjoy a fresh seafood lunch on board. We will make a few stops at some of the interesting areas along the way. Optional activities include kayaking, swimming, traditional massage,

Vietnamese cooking demonstrations, and much more! We'll enjoy an on-board dinner followed by music. This area might have the coolest weather we'll encounter on the trip. **B, L, D.**

Day 8: Sunday, March 4: Ha Long – Hanoi – Hue: This morning after breakfast we cruise to visit Sung Sot ("surprise") cave and other lovely spots. We enjoy brunch before we arrive back at the main pier and board our bus for the ride back to Hanoi. We'll have some time this afternoon to walk around Hanoi, before heading to the airport for our flight to Hue in the early evening. Upon arrival in Hue, we'll be transferred from the airport to our hotel. Overnight at Saigon Moirin Hotel (<http://www.morinhotel.com.vn/default.aspx>). **Brunch.**

Day 9: Monday, March 5: Hue, with tour of DMZ: In the morning we'll drive up to the Demilitarized Zone during the war, in Quang Tri Province, which was once among the bloodiest site during the Vietnam War. It remains a fascinating place to visit, with a museum and relics of the war still visible. Back to Hue for lunch. In the afternoon, we'll enjoy a boat ride up the Perfume River to visit the Thien Mu Pagoda and Minh Mang tomb.

Hue is the ancient capital of the Anamneses people. It was long a beautiful architectural, educational and cultural center of Indochina. The current population is around 250,000. The Perfume



River bisects the city. On the south side is the area called New Hue and on the north is the historic old Citadel, which enclosed their Imperial Forbidden City. During the TET Offensive, US Marines fought for 24 days to retake the city. Sadly, a lot of the Citadel was destroyed but most remains and it is all a must-see. Lots to see and do in this area. Overnight at Saigon Moirin Hotel. **B, L, D.**

Day 10: Tuesday, March 6: Hue – Hoi An: In the morning we'll take a tour of Hue, including the historic Citadel, which housed the Imperial Forbidden City. In the afternoon we'll depart Hue and travel over the Hai Van Pass on our way to historic Hoi An. The peak of Hai Van offers spectacular views of mountains and sea—not to be missed! We'll also stop in Da Nang City for lunch and a visit to the beautiful Cham museum, displaying the artifacts of the Cham people who lived in central Vietnam a thousand years ago. Fascinating! Finally, we're on to Hoi An Beach Resort on the South China Sea. Overnight at the Hoi An Beach Resort (<http://www.hoianbeachresort.com.vn/>). **B, L, D.**

Day 11: Wednesday, March 7: Hoi An – HCMC (Ho Chi Minh City/Saigon): Today we fly from Da Nang to lively HCMC. When we arrive in the main section of the old city we will make a short stop to go into the old classic post office as well as take a look at the Catholic Church called Notre Dame de Paris. If we have time we will visit the colorful main market to absorb the sights and sounds. The historic Majestic Hotel (<http://majesticsaigon.com.vn/>) usually provides a welcome drink upon our arrival at the hotel. The hotel has a gym and



nice little interior outdoor pool. For the best views of the Saigon River in town, go up to either of the two open-air bars on two different rooftops. Around 6:30 p.m. we enjoy another outstanding pedicab ride (approximately 45 minutes), which ends at our hotel. You are on your own for dinner. **B.**

Day 12: Thursday, March 8: HCMC (Cu Chi Tour): This morning we bus for about 2 hours to an area that played a major role in the Vietnam conflict. The area is called Cu Chi. It was in this area the Viet Cong built a massive underground tunnel system. They lived in, and fought from, this underground network. It is amazing to see what they built and how they lived and functioned. We will tour this area. We are back in HCMC early afternoon after which you have free time. Of course if you don't want to go the tunnels you can use this as a full free day. You are on your own for lunch and dinner. **B, L.**

Day 13: Friday, March 9. HCMC – Vinh Long – Can Tho in the Mekong Delta: We will depart around 7:30 a.m. The first part of today takes us three hours south to the Cai Be boat station. We have a boat reserved for our group, which will run us around a bit of the massive Delta area. We will spend some time walking on one of the islands, by homes and through little villages, and getting a feel for rural life in that area. We will enjoy lunch at the San Giao Bonsai Gardens. Afterward we proceed an hour or so to Can Tho where we check into the five-star Victoria Can Tho (<http://www.victoriahotels-asia.com/eng/hotels-in->

vietnam/can-tho-resort) for a one-night stay. Our rooms face the river (some direct views, some at an angle). You are on your own for dinner.

Can Tho, known as the beating heart of the Mekong Delta, is home to charming riverside landscapes, paddy fields, floating market and myriad of canals creating some of the most beautiful views appreciated by travelers and amateur photographers alike. This hotel is set in a magnificent garden on the banks of the Hau River, the low-rise colonial architecture of the hotel blends superbly with the natural beauty of the river. **B, L.**

Day 14: Saturday, March 10: Can Tho: Around 6:30 a.m. we will embark on a fantastic boat ride to visit the huge main floating markets in the area, including Cai Rang and Phong Dien. Notice the orchids and the houses built on stilts. You will greatly enjoy this morning experience.

Around 8:30 a.m. we check out of the hotel and head north back to HCMC for a one-night stay at back at the Majestic Hotel. This evening we will enjoy a farewell dinner in an unusual setting to include a half-liter of wine per person or soft drink or water as substitute. Be sure to lay out tonight what you want to wear on the flight home tomorrow. **B, L, D.**

Day 15: Sunday, March 11. Today we begin the journey back home. Transfer to the airport is provided. On the return to the USA we gain a day crossing the international dateline on the way home so arrive same date. **B.**

WELCOME HOME!

Trip Notes:

- We need 10 people signed up to make this trip a firm go at this price. We will not take more than 20 people. All limited spots sold on a first come, first served basis.
- Because it will be a small group, the number of single rooms available is limited.
- All busses will be in good condition and are air-conditioned. In most cases the busses in Vietnam do not have bathrooms on them, but on the few days we are on a bus we make timely stops.
- All hotels have great air-conditioning systems that really cool.
- You will have an English-speaking guide for each region—one for Hanoi, Sapa, and Ha Long Bay; one for Hue, Danang, and Hoi An; and one for Saigon and its vicinities. If the group has 20 people, then you would have a guide the entire time.



The cash-discounted, land-only price of \$2,999 ppdo (\$3,699 single occupancy) includes:

- The internal Vietnam air flights (2 total: Hanoi to Hue; Da Nang to Saigon)
- Lodging in what are considered excellent to deluxe air conditioned hotels, all rooms with private bath/shower. Note that sometimes hotels need to be changed, and we reserve

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the right to substitute a comparable hotel.

- 2 nights on an elegant train from Hanoi to Sapa and back (4 to a train compartment)
- 1 night on a nice boat on Ha Long Bay
- Luggage transfers provided
- Meals as indicated
- Half-liter wine per person for the welcome and farewell dinners
- All entrance fees and sightseeing as outlined in the itinerary
- Nice air-conditioned buses
- The services of excellent English-speaking guides
- Assistance with obtaining the Vietnam visa
- A pre-trip meeting in Portland for those who can make it
- A final information packet with all you need to know
- A post-trip picture party (usually hosted by one of the Portland travelers)

Single Travelers

A limited number of single rooms are available. If you are a solo traveler and are willing to share a room with another solo traveler of the same gender, please let us know. We provide a roommate-matching service.

International Air (from the USA to Hanoi, and home from HCMC)

Once the minimum 10 people have signed up, we will investigate air for those who want us to book their tickets. Then, we will seek the best air and routing and book the tickets for you unless you have indicated on the sign-up sheet that you want to obtain your own air. There is a \$25 services fee per person for us to book your flights for you.

We need to land in Hanoi on February 27 and fly out of Saigon on (unless you are extending) on March 11. **If you are planning to make your own air arrangements, please do not do so until we tell you the trip is a firm "go."** If you arrive in Hanoi or leave HCMC at same time the group arrives or leaves, you are more than welcome to ride the group bus from the airport to the hotel and back to the airport. If not, you will need to take a taxi to the hotel unless you request us to arrange a private transfer at an additional cost.

Important Note: The prices shown above are cash-discounted prices. There will be a 3.3% processing fee added to any amount of the deposit that is charged. When the final payment time comes the 3.3% processing will apply only to the land cost, not to the airfare portion of the trip we might arrange for you.

Deposit: \$450 per person due no later than December 15, 2011. Upon receipt of your deposit a receipt letter and more information will be mailed to you. The deposit can be made by cash, check, or credit card (MasterCard, Visa and Discover only, please).

Final payment date: January 15, 2012. An invoice will be mailed to you prior to this date explaining all the options for final payment.

The cost does NOT include:

- International air
- Any beverage costs other than the welcome and farewell dinners, which include a half-liter of wine per person
- Any excess baggage costs
- Trip cancellation insurance (highly recommended and available through Pat and Mike's Travel)
- Tipping for our guide, the bus driver, and any local guides that might join us for an excursion (normally, each person tips \$4.00 per day for the guide and \$1.00 per day for the bus driver)
- Any visa charge for entry into Vietnam and Cambodia
- Laundry
- Any excursions/sightseeing options not mentioned in the itinerary
- Medical expenses, including anti-malarial medication or other immunizations
- Airport departure tax (which I think is around \$10 per person when we leave HCMC)

As with all international trips, the cost of the trip was based on exchange rates at the time of costing and is always subject to change until final payment has been made after we invoice you.

Passports

Passports are required. Please submit a copy of the picture page of your passport along with your sign-up sheet. Check and see that your passport is valid for six months after the date of March 11, 2011.

Health

You must be in basic good health. No real hiking is involved, but there is uneven ground around many of the historic sites. In Sapa we will be walking down paths into villages in little valleys, which means we need to walk up out of the little valleys. Plus, there will be some stairs. If you have problems walking there will be things you might miss seeing.

We recommend contacting your local travel immunization clinic to see what they recommend for immunizations. Malaria pills are not mandated as necessary by our National Center for Disease Control (CDC) in Atlanta, as we are in a nice travel groove with nice hotels, etc., and we're not really spending time in malaria areas. On past trips a couple of people have taken anti-malaria pills as a precaution while most chose not to. No one caught malaria.

If you are extending to Cambodia, however, anti-malarial medication is recommended. Again, discuss with your doctor or local international traveler's clinic.

Trip Cancellation Penalty

This is the amount a person would forfeit if they had to cancel for any reason during the dates shown below:

- Up to December 15, 2011: \$100
- December 15, 2011, to January 15, 2012: \$450
- January 15 onward: 100%

Trip insurance is always recommended and is available via our office. Upon receipt of your deposit, information on trip cancellation insurance will be mailed to you.

If you or an immediate family member have a pre-existing medical condition or you are not sure if your condition is considered as a pre-existing condition, and you are afraid it might keep you from obtaining trip cancellation insurance, please call the insurance company directly. Normally, if you take out trip cancellation insurance at the time of sign-up (or within 14 or 20 days of signing up, depending on the company) your pre-existing condition is waived.



The last pages are the sign-up sheets: You can pay the deposit by check made out to “Pat and Mike's Travel Company” and mail to our address shown at the top of the first page inside the cover. Please note “Vietnam” at bottom of the check somewhere.

OTHER GENERAL INFORMATION

Luggage: Each person is limited to one large suitcase with 44-48 lbs. maximum and one carry-on bag. (It's best if the suitcase has wheels and a pull-handle these days.) You don't need more. Yes, the airlines say you can check two suitcases per person but the problem comes with the land operators and they restrict you to one large suitcase. Two reasons:

1. There is not enough room in the cargo area of the bus to carry two large suitcases per person. You would wind up with your second one sitting on your lap.
2. The trip includes the portage of one suitcase per person from the bus to your hotel room and back at four- and five-star hotels. At three-star hotels we might be asked to pull our luggage to our rooms, as they don't have the hotel staff to transport the luggage in a timely manner.

You don't need more than one suitcase with 44-48 lbs. of stuff per person. We are not on a fashion show type trip, and it's OK to wear the same thing more than once or to mix and match. The trick is to be comfortable, not dressed up all the time. We are on vacation!

Pat & Mike's reserves the right to accept or decline any person as a passenger on one of our custom-designed trips should such person's health or mental condition, physical infirmity or general deportment impede the operation of the tour or the rights and welfare or enjoyment of other tour passengers; and the refund of unused land tour services is the limit of Pat & Mike's Travel Company liability.

TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE

Available through Pat & Mike's Travel. If you want to sign up for a trip, please read the following:

1. IF YOU DON'T HAVE A PRE-EXISTING MEDICAL CONCERN / CONDITION (EITHER YOU OR A MEMBER OF YOUR IMMEDIATE FAMILY) OR IF YOU HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT IF YOU HAVE A PRE-EXISTING CONDITION OR NOT. Mail in your sign-up sheets, deposit and a copy of the picture page of your passport. We will send you a receipt letter that contains a trip cancellation insurance policy for you to review for possible purchase. If you want to purchase the insurance, you will need to complete the application and mail it (along with the premium), directly to the insurance company, not to us.

But before you mail it, check with us make sure we have enough signed up to ensure the trip is a go. If we cancel the trip, you will receive your deposit back in full, so there is no need to pay an insurance premium when there is no risk. We will inform you when there we have enough people signed up to ensure the trip is a firm go. Then you can purchase the insurance.

Another thing to consider before you purchase the insurance: Look at the trip cancellation policy and see what dollar amount you would lose on such and such dates if you had to cancel. It is smart to wait until the amount you would lose if you cancelled is greater than the insurance premium amount. For example: You sign up today and for the next four months all you would lose if you had to cancel is, let's say, \$50. Let's say the insurance premium is \$250. There is no need to pay \$250 premium to get \$50 back if you had to cancel. Find the date that the cancellation penalty is greater than \$250 and then mail in the insurance premium.

2. IF YOU DON'T KNOW FOR SURE IF YOU OR A MEMBER OF YOUR IMMEDIATE FAMILY HAS A CONDITION THAT MIGHT FALL UNDER WHAT THE INSURANCE COMPANY CALLS A PRE-EXISTING CONDITON. Before you sign up for the trip, call the insurance company and tell them you are thinking about going on a trip and before you sign up for the trip, or the trip cancellation insurance, you want to fully understand what the insurance company considers a "pre-existing condition" for you or a member of your immediate family. Ask follow-up questions. Insurance companies change rules all the time. I heard one person say they were told that if you take high blood pressure medicine, even though your BP readings are fine, it is still considered a pre-existing condition. Again, ask follow-up questions and get the name of the person you are talking with. The name of the insurance company is TRAVEL INSURED. Their telephone number is 1.800.243.3174.

Most times if a person has a pre-existing condition, or if a member of their immediate family does, the insurance company will waive the pre-existing condition IF the insurance is purchase within 14 days of signing up for the trip.

If the insurance company tells you that you or a member of your immediate family has a pre-existing condition and you want to go on the trip and purchase trip cancellation insurance:

Call us and tell us that you have a pre-existing condition situation and you want to sign up for the trip for sure. We will pencil you in. Then find out if there are enough signed up yet to ensure the trip is a go.

If there is not enough then ask Pat & Mike's to add your name(s) to those wanting to go on the trip and when enough have signed up, and you are notified of such, then you would mail in the sign-up pages, the copy of the picture page of your passport and the deposit to Pat & Mike's AND at the same time mail off the trip cancellation insurance application along with the premium direct to the insurance company (not to Pat & Mike's).
